Question for written answer E-000131/2017 to the Commission Rule 130 Maria Noichl (S&D)

Subject: Asian long-horned beetle

Since the Asian long-horned beetle was first found in Germany in 2004, finds of fresh infestations in Germany have increased year by year.

In 2016, two new infestations with Asian long-horned beetles in Germany were reported from Bavaria: first in the port area at Kelheim on the Danube and then a few weeks ago in Murnau. In Feldkirchen quaranteen area (Messestadt Riem and the 'Riemer Wäldchen' wood), further symptoms of infestation have been found. These fresh finds raise the following questions:

- 1. What is the current prevalence of Asian long-horned beetles in Europe, and how likely is it that further infestations of Asian long-horned beetles exist in the EU outside the areas already known to be infested?
- 2. How many Asian long-horned beetles are there currently within EU territory, what new infestations were found in the EU in 2016 and how were these finds made (e.g. specific monitoring, chance)?
- 3. Where and by whom have targeted searches been or are they being undertaken in the EU as a whole for infestations of Asian long-horned beetles, and what criteria have been/are being applied for the purpose of selecting the areas to be searched, and if no targeted searches are being or have been conducted, why not?
