Subject: E-democracy and enhancing traditional democracy through ICT

E-democracy supports and enhances traditional democracy through information and communication technologies (ICT) and may supplement the democratic processes by adding elements of civic engagement through a number of online activities, including electronic voting.

E-democracy tools can help foster more active citizenship by improving participation, transparency and accountability in decision-making by buttressing democratic oversight mechanisms and knowledge about the EU and giving citizens a stronger voice in political life.

The introduction of electronic voting is a matter which is very often discussed and gives rise to a number of issues. On the one hand, for example, it could help people living or working in a Member State of which they are not a citizen or in a third country to exercise their voting rights. On the other hand, it brings worries, for example, regarding personal data safety.

- 1. To guarantee the safety and privacy of personal data and voting, particularly given the chances of a cyberattack, what specific actions will the Commission propose as part of a future electronic voting and voter registration process?
- 2. How will the Commission deal with the challenges posed by electronic voting, and how will it encourage the Member States to introduce it?
