Subject: Achieving the aims of the Bologna Process

In October 2016, the President of the University of Hamburg, Dieter Lenzen, criticised the Bologna reform¹. Mr Lenzen argued that student mobility had not increased as a result of the Bologna Process, emphasising in particular the problems in obtaining recognition for modules taken during semesters abroad, which he believes will deter many students.

Mobility has always been central to the Bologna Process. How much has student mobility increased to date as a result of the Bologna Process?

The 2015 report 'Monitoring the implementation of the Bologna Process'²called for more financial support for mobility. How much financial support on average is currently provided per student funded by the programme?

How high are the administrative costs of the Erasmus programme each year?
