Subject: OLAF report indictment rates

After completing its investigations, OLAF makes recommendations to national authorities on legal steps to take. National authorities are obliged, where so requested, to supply information to OLAF on the action taken. OLAF has listed the decisions of national judicial authorities in its 2017 annual report (page 43, figure 15).

The Slovak judicial authorities have prosecuted two out of eight OLAF cases – the lowest take-up rate for OLAF reports.

1. On what grounds did the national judicial authorities dismiss 9 out of the 11 OLAF cases?
2. What were the OLAF cases about?
3. What made it possible to bring charges in the above-mentioned two cases, and to which EU funds did those cases relate?
