Subject: VP/HR - Follow-up question to Question E-000098/2019

Unfortunately, the High Representative did not answer the Member's question. The Member wanted to know what wishes, demands and/or requests the EU had addressed to Germany in the context of its membership of the UN Security Council.

In response, the author received lengthy explanations to the effect that those Member States that are also members coordinate positions among themselves. They are free to do so. However, the Member States are not the same thing as the EU, which has its own legal personality. In addition, the EU also has a special aspiration to act in the field of foreign policy, which means that, to the Member, it is simply not conceivable that the EU as such has not informed Germany of any desiderata of its own.

- 1. The Member therefore reiterates the question in the expectation that the EU, through its representatives, must indeed have addressed demands, wishes or requests to Germany, and asks the Commission to say what they are or were.
- 2. The Member also wishes to extend the question: what demands, wishes or requests has the EU addressed to its members in the past when they were (non-permanent) members of the Security Council?
- 3. If the High Representative did not present any demands, wishes or requests in the past, what demands, wishes or requests would she make if she decided to do so?
