Subject: Homelessness

The actions of the Fund for European Aid to the Most Deprived (FEAD) seek to promote social inclusion (type 2).

Germany has defined two target groups for this purpose: (a) particularly deprived migrants from EU countries and their children; and (b) homeless people and people threatened by homelessness. In Germany, 21 450 homeless persons and people threatened by homelessness received advice and social support¹.

Can the Commission say what categories of homeless people (people who do not have a home or people who live on the street) are concerned?

Can the Commission also state what exactly this advice involves and what impact it has had?

How many homeless people have found a home or even a job after receiving advice and so have in fact been reintegrated into the community?
