Subject: Coca-Cola fined for LGBTI campaign in Hungary

In Hungary, the Pest county government office has imposed a fine on Coca-Cola for launching a billboard campaign in August 2019 entitled #loveislove. The campaign posters pictured both heterosexual and homosexual couples and a clear message that everyone has the right to love. The government office justified its decision by referring to a section of Hungarian advertising law prohibiting advertising that 'harms the physical, mental, emotional and moral development of children and minors'. István Boldog, a member of the Fidesz party and the Hungarian National Assembly, also called for a public boycott of Coca-Cola in response to its campaign.

- 1. Does the Commission believe that the decision of the government office fundamentally violates the basic EU principle of non-discrimination based on sexual orientation laid down in Article 2 of the TEU, Article 21 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights and legislation on the single market?
- 2. Does it agree that the decision is a clear and deplorable example of discrimination against the LGBTI community? .
- 3. What action will it take to stop the Hungarian Government from committing politically motivated, conscious breaches of EU law with the aim of propagating homophobia and hatred against minorities?
