Subject: EU funding for treatment programmes aimed at integrating violent offenders from a migrant background

On 25 June 2007, the Council adopted the Decision establishing the European Fund for the Integration of third-country nationals for the period 2007 to 2013 (2007/435/EC, OJ L 168/18, 28.6.2007). This also supported non-hospital treatment programmes aimed at integrating violent offenders from a migrant background (EIF 07-316).

1. Have violent offenders from a migrant background been successfully integrated as a result of these programmes?
2. Are there follow-up programmes or alternative programmes (each broken down by project and financial support, number of people treated, their gender, country of origin, age, religious affiliation, residence status, average duration of treatment per person and criminal / professional activity before and after the treatment in the 2007-2013 funding period, or for follow-up programmes since 2014) in which so-called refugees among the violent offenders are also to be integrated?
3. What outcome does the Council expect from integrating violent offenders with a migrant background into the peaceful societies of the Member States?
