Subject: Trafficking in human beings and sexual exploitation in the context of the migration crisis

I refer to Commissioner Dalli's replies (E-003319/2019 and E-003321/2019).

According to them, the EU classifies trafficking in human beings for purposes of sexual exploitation as violence against women and girls and aims to fight trafficking in human beings.

1. To what extent is the Commission aware of cases in which trafficking in human beings and sexual exploitation have occurred which have made use of migration flows or been assisted by them?
2. How can the Commission stop the spread of clan crime if its perpetrators can continue to enter the EU freely at any time via migration routes?
3. Is sufficient attention devoted to the possession and origin of cash, precious metals, jewellery and other valuables at border crossing points in order to be able to identify and prevent financial flows from illegal activities ('following the money')?
