Subject: Quota for women under the EU-Turkey Migration Agreement – Part 3

I refer to Commissioner Johansson's reply (P-003392/2019).

Under the EU-Turkey Agreement, 25 000 migrants from Turkey (12 455 men and 13 059 women) were resettled in the EU between 4.4.2016 and 10.11.2019, most of whom, according to the reply, were families.

Although there were no particular gender quotas, those resettled 'also include women and children at risk'.

At the same time, 1 954 migrants were returned to Turkey under the Agreement.

1. How is kinship determined in cases where so-called refugees have no papers?
2. Why were almost 13 times as many migrants resettled as were returned to Turkey under the Agreement?
3. How will the Commission deal with refusals of readmission applications on the part of Turkey as it tries to implement the 1:1 quota (returns / resettlement) set out in the Agreement?
