Subject: Sport as a means of integration and social inclusion for refugees - Part 2

I refer to Commissioner Gabriel's answer (E-003824/2019).

The programme catalogue ¹ includes various projects relating to migration, with total funding of EUR 4 393 611.

According to the Commissioner, no assessments are yet available for projects funded in 2016, 2017 and 2018.

If, after four years, there is still no specific assessment of funding programmes, how can the Commission assess whether a given funding purpose has been achieved and whether further funding with taxpayers' money makes sense?

According to the EACEA ², the Ruhr University Bochum is receiving EU funding of EUR 392 437 for the 'Integration of Newly Arrived Migrants' programme (613220-EPP-1-2019-1-DE-SPOSCP).

Is the Commission aware of what is actually being done with this money in the case of this specific project?

In the abovementioned question I had specifically inquired about acts of violence in sport carried out by migrants, but to no avail.

To what extent does Erasmus + provide for measures to prevent violence in sport in the context of such projects?
