Subject: Relaunching of Operation Sophia in the Mediterranean

Operation Sophia was originally intended to be a means of overseeing the United Nations' arms embargo against Libya; but it created an incentive for use to be made of the cross-Mediterranean migration route.

EU High Representative Borrell has now proposed that the Mediterranean operation be relaunched, possibly further to the east.

- 1. How can it be ensured that no new migration route is established to the east of the old route?
- 2. How can it be ensured that the arms embargo is overseen by naval forces without at the same time creating new incentives for people smugglers and illegal migrants?
- 3. What would be the impact on costs of a change in the area of operations towards the east in this instance and would the set-up and running costs for the operation change?
