Subject: Revision of the Dublin Regulation

In November 2017, the European Parliament proposed a radical reform of the Dublin Regulation, which was supported by all political groups. In particular, it was proposed to adopt a binding mechanism ensuring that all EU countries receive persons fleeing war zones in line with their capacity to do so. Although Parliament's position is clear, it appears that the governments of some Member States are refusing to show solidarity with Member States affected by strong migratory flows.

Will the Commission say:

1. In view of the latest developments, is there a timetable for action to resume talks on a revision of the Dublin 3 Regulation?
2. Does it intend to set up a task force consisting of leading figures to promote a revision of the Dublin 3 Regulation?
