Participation in the centralised procurement of masks organised by the European Subject:

Commission

In light of the health crisis caused by COVID-19, as part of the coordinated response to combat the pandemic, the European Commission has provided the Member States with a mechanism for the centralised procurement of health supplies and equipment, such as personal protection equipment (PPE), protective masks and ventilators.

Thus, since mid-March, Member States have been able to submit requests directly to the Commission for assistance in securing such medical supplies.

On 8 May 2020, Commissioner Kyriakides announced the centralised purchase which would allow 1.5 million masks to be distributed to 18 European countries: Austria, Poland, Malta, Cyprus, Denmark, Sweden, Finland, the Netherlands, France, Italy, Croatia, Slovenia, Greece, Romania, Bulgaria, Slovakia and Hungary in addition to the United Kingdom. Spain is not among the list of countries provided by the Commissioner.

- Can the Commission confirm that Spain did indeed decide not to participate in this centralised procurement of medical supplies at European level?
- Given the extremely high mortality rate caused by COVID-19 in Europe, in particular in Spain, 2. what is the Commission's assessment of the fact that Spain is not participating in this European health coordination measure?
