Subject: Request for clarifications on the consistency with Directive 92/43/EEC of the motion for the division of title to the Lago di Paola into lots

The Rome District Court has ruled that a motion to divide title to the Lago di Paola, which is located in the Province of Latina and regarded as a Special Area of Conservation and a Site of Community Interest, into lots is admissible.

Under Article 6(2) of Directive 92/43/CEE on the conservation of natural habitats and of wild fauna and flora, Member States are required to adopt appropriate measures to prevent, within Special Areas of Conservation, the deterioration of natural habitats and species and the disturbance of species in designated zones.

In the light of this, I ask the Commission the following questions:

1. does it not regard the division of title to the Lago di Paola into lots as a violation of current Union law?
2. does it not consider that the possible division of title to the Lago di Paola into lots, and the resulting fragmentation of tidal flow management, could compromise the uniqueness and environmental balance of this site?
