## Question for written answer E-006206/2020 to the Commission Rule 138 Harald Vilimsky (ID)

## Subject: Coronavirus and animal transports

The increasing number of coronavirus cases across Europe risks exacerbating the situation for crossborder animal transports, just as it did in March. I would like to ask the following in connection with this:

- 1. Has the Commission learnt from the errors made in March and taken measures to protect animals so as to ensure that they are adequately cared for during cross-border transports and that they do not suffer unnecessarily?
- 2. Is the Commission considering definitively suspending animal transports during the pandemic in order to protect animals? Why is the Commission not considering a general ban?
- 3. Will official veterinarians at the borders be withdrawn, just like last time? Will the Commission again relax the rules further, thus sending the wrong signal?
