Subject: The ceasefire in Nagorno-Karabakh

After more than 40 days of fighting, on 9 November 2020 Armenia and Azerbaijan signed a Russian-brokered joint declaration establishing a comprehensive ceasefire in Nagorno-Karabakh. This is a first step towards peace in the region. A lot of time and work will need to be put in to ensure the ceasefire is lasting and sustainable. In Armenia, for example, the signing of the agreement has triggered a worrying political crisis that could in turn result in further instability in the region and therefore also in Europe.

In the light of the foregoing:

- 1. What steps is the Commission intending to take to make sure the ceasefire holds?
- 2. Is the Commission planning to step up political and diplomatic efforts, alongside the Minsk Group and the other Member States, to move towards a fair and lasting solution for both parties?
- 3. How does the Commission think the European Neighbourhood Policy has performed in the light of increasing tensions and conflicts at the EU's borders?
