Subject: Ecosystem emergency in the south-west Caribbean

A partnership between scientific and cultural organisations known as Gran Seaflower¹ warned on 12 October 2020 that the world's third-largest coral reef, which stretches out over Colombia, Costa Rica, Honduras, Jamaica, Nicaragua and Panama, is deteriorating dangerously.

This biological system has shrunk by over 50% in less than four decades due to human impact, and the situation is getting worse each year.

The ecosystem emergency in the south-west Caribbean is devastating families and communities living in the region, which could affect life across the globe.
