Subject: Forced organ harvesting in China, especially from Falun Gong practitioners

Parliament adopted a resolution on organ harvesting in China back in 20131.

In March 2020, the China Tribunal<sup>2</sup> came to the unanimous conclusion that there has been forced organ harvesting throughout China for years, and that Falun Gong practitioners have probably been the main source of organ supply<sup>3</sup>.

- 1. What measures has the Commission taken recently to urge China to immediately cease the persecution of Falun Gong in all its forms, the most horrendous being forced organ harvesting?
- 2. Will the Commission proactively express its view on the persecution of the Falun Gong, and on those involved in this persecution?
- 3. Why is the Commission engaged in extensive and ongoing economic collaboration with the Chinese Communist Party, in light of all the existing evidence of its inhumane treatment of its citizens solely on the basis of their spiritual beliefs?
