## Question for written answer E-006833/2020/rev.1 to the Commission Rule 138 Carles Puigdemont i Casamajó (NI)

Subject: Violents threats and extreme-right elements in the Spanish Army

On 2 December 2020, the media reported that a group of retired Spanish military officials had sent a letter to King Felipe VI expressing their concern about the relations between the Spanish Government and pro-independence parties<sup>1</sup>. King Felipe VI did not disallow the letter.

Moreover, as revealed by José Ignacio Dominguez, a retired Lieutenant-Colonel of the Spanish Army, a number of the same high-ranking officials speculated about the possibility of bombing the Catalan National Assembly<sup>2</sup> or organising a coup d'état in a WhatsApp chat. Since the end of the dictatorship, similar comments have been heard every few years.

In contrast, the German Government recently dissolved a special forces unit over its far-right links in an exemplary measure for the EU<sup>3</sup>.

Is the Commission aware of these facts?

How does it evaluate the measures taken by Member States to purge extreme-right elements from their armies?

Taking into account the desire to increase integration in the field of defence, will it propose guidelines to ensure that all Member States take a similar approach?
