## Question for written answer E-000865/2021 to the Commission Rule 138 Christine Anderson (ID)

Subject: Polish Government attempts to achieve increased freedom of speech and opinion on social networks

The Justice Ministry has drawn up a bill to the effect that legal content on social media may not be deleted or sanctioned.<sup>1</sup> The bill is an attempt to increase freedom of speech, protect against ideological censorship and take a stand against double standards.

Users will be able to send a complaint about incidents of this kind to the platform, which will then have 24 hours to reach a decision.

The full title of the law is the 'law on freedom of expressing one's own views and searching and disseminating information on the internet'. There are also plans to establish a special court for freedom of speech, which will operate electronically.

- 1. Is the Commission aware of the bill? What is its assessment of the content?
- 2. Does the Commission approve of the content, and is it planning to introduce similar objectives for the European Union?
- 3. Does the Commission think there is currently a threat to or reduction in freedom of opinion on social media in the Member States, and how does it explain its assessment?
