Subject: The EU's position at the UN Food Systems Summit

The Farm to Fork Strategy contains helpful targets for reductions in the use of antimicrobials and chemical pesticides and fertilisers. The Biodiversity Strategy identifies organic farming, agro-ecology, agro-forestry and low-intensive permanent grassland as sustainable practices. The Farm to Fork Strategy aims to have at least 25 % of the EU's agricultural land under organic farming by 2030 and to improve animal welfare.

Will the Commission urge the Council to adopt similar positions to those of the Farm to Fork and Biodiversity Strategies at the UN Food Systems Summit?

The UN's action track discussion papers for the Food Systems Summit aim to boost regenerative agriculture and nature-positive food production. They also aim to encourage a shift to healthy and sustainable diets, including less red and processed meat, and a greater uptake of plant-rich diets.

Will the Commission urge the Council to adopt positions that support the ambitions in these action track discussion papers?
