Subject: The new interim unity government and the elections in Libya

Since NATO-backed forces ousted Muammar Gaddaffi in 2011, Libya has been a war-torn country divided by two political forces in the east and west.

This instability has also allowed Libya to become a key trafficking point for migrants to reach Europe.

On 5 February 2021, delegates at a United Nations-led forum in Geneva established an interim unity government.

The establishment of this interim unity government is seen as a major step towards unifying the country and bringing its conflicts to an end, and is also expected to foster unity ahead of the national election in December 2021.

- 1. What action has the VP/HR taken to mitigate the two parallel political wings and to reduce the political tension?
- 2. Will he have a crucial role in the national reconciliation process and in the plans to hold an election by the end of the year?
- 3. What steps is he taking in order to combat security threats and the economic crisis that Libyans are facing?
