Question for written answer E-001303/2021 to the Commission Rule 138 Angelika Winzig (PPE)

Subject: Monitoring the distribution and financing of Islamist propaganda

On 16 October 2020, the French Minister of the Interior announced his intention to dissolve¹ the 'Collective Against Islamophobia in France' (CCIF)², citing allegations that it had engaged in 'Islamist propaganda' in connection with the murder of teacher Samuel Paty. Shortly afterwards, the CCIF announced that it would base itself outside France³ and planned to transfer its financial assets abroad. In October 2020, the Collective for Countering Islamophobia in Europe (CCIE)⁴ was set up in Belgium to - in its own words - continue the fight against Islamophobia.

- 1. Using the full extent of its powers, will the Commission encourage cross-border investigations to address the allegations concerning the distribution of Islamist propaganda by the CCIF/CCIE and its partner organisations?
- 2. Are investigations being conducted into the financing of the CCIF/CCIE from outside the Union?
- 3. How will the Commission monitor organisations like the CCIF, BarakaCity and Collectif Cheikh-Yassine, which have been banned by the French Government and are likely to set up operations in other Member States?
