Question for written answer E-001308/2021 to the Commission Rule 138 Christine Anderson (ID)

Subject: Honour-related violence against women

Women are repeatedly victims of violence. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the situation has worsened further and numbers have increased significantly<sup>1</sup>. Figures for honour-related violence are on the rise too. Websites promising help<sup>2</sup> will not be effective if policymakers fail to establish the framework needed for criminal prosecutions to be brought for honour-related violence. Reliable figures for the scale of such crimes are lacking, however. In its answer to my question E-005214/2020³ the Commission simply states the following: 'Eurostat is currently coordinating an EU survey on gender-based violence and other forms of interpersonal violence. Results are expected in 2023 and data should help us to better target the efforts to tackle the phenomenon of gender-based violence.'

- 1. To what extent provided that the political will is there can the process be speeded up so that the survey results are delivered before 2023?
- 2. In addition to recording details relating to victims, are efforts being made to record offender characteristics such as cultural and religious background?
- 3. How is the Commission addressing the link between the increase in honour-related violence against women and immigration from Muslim countries where there is no equality between men and women?
