Question for written answer E-001553/2021 to the Commission Rule 138 Lukas Mandl (PPE)

Subject: Restoring freedom to travel and meet in person

On 17 March 2021, the Commission submitted a draft regulation on deploying a Digital Green Certificate with the aim of gradually restoring freedom to travel and enabling personal encounters. It also raises the prospect of recognising equivalent certificates from non-EU countries where vaccines approved by the European Medicines Agency (EMA) have been used and providing the non-EU country concerned also fully accepts the EU certificate. Irrespective of the draft regulation, negotiations with non-EU countries are also necessary to ensure soonest-possible mutual recognition and the corresponding broader freedom to travel globally for EU citizens.

- 1. Are negotiations already under way with non-EU countries or are such negotiations likely to start soon, so that the mutual recognition of certificates can begin as soon as possible?
- 2. What is the Commission's strategy with regard to such negotiations with non-EU countries which use mainly vaccines not approved by the EMA?
- 3. Has the Commission launched initiatives in cooperation with the World Health Organization (WHO) to produce certificates which will be accepted globally?
