Subject: 'Non-Paper' containing a proposal for the review of the Dayton Accord

It has emerged that the Slovenian Prime Minister, Janez Janša, has sent an unofficial 'non-paper' to the President of the European Council, Charles Michel. According to reports, the Slovenian Government wants to raise the issue of 'finalising the process of breaking up Yugoslavia' and reshape the borders of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

The Slovenian President, Borut Pahor, has also alluded to this. This shows that, even if such a document does not exist, the idea is common currency among those in power in Ljubljana.

My questions are:

1. Is the Commission aware of the existence of such a document?
2. What is the Commission's attitude to the idea of reviewing the Dayton Accord and reshaping the borders of Bosnia and Herzegovina?
