## Question for written answer E-002141/2021 to the Council Rule 138

Subject: Freedom of expression in Venezuela: the *El Nacional* ruling

Freedom of the press is an indispensable fundamental right in any full democracy. The recent ruling against the Venezuelan newspaper *El Nacional*, debated by many in the international arena who believe it did not receive a fair trial, is yet another example of the authoritarian practices of Nicolás Maduro's dictatorship, which is progressing in its curtailment of the freedoms of the Venezuelan people.

In a case brought by the then President of the National Assembly, Diosdado Cabello, the editor of *El Nacional* has been fined USD 13 366 800 for printing details of an interview published by the Spanish daily *ABC* with an associate of Cabello who alleged he was involved in illegal activities.

This is the culmination of a string of actions persecuting journalists, managers and shareholders throughout Venezuela's 77-year media history.

In view of the above:

- 1. How does the Council view this fresh attack on press freedom?
- 2. Is it considering extending the current sanctions to the Maduro regime and to officials involved in further violations of fundamental rights such as those described above?
