Subject: A new framework for European legislation

Europe can only overcome the tremendous challenges of the present time by acting in unison. The pandemic more than anything has shown that decisions must be made more quickly and decisively. - Will the Commission set up an independent regulatory control council to assess bureaucracy costs and the safeguarding of the subsidiarity principle during the preparatory phase of new regulations at all levels, thereby limiting costs?
- 3. How will the Commission actively advocate for the European Parliament to have a full right of legislative initiative and all-encompassing budgetary powers?
