Subject: Lack of information from the Commission regarding foreign interference in Europe

In recent months, I have, for the purposes of parliamentary oversight, repeatedly sought information from the Commission regarding foreign interference in Europe. I was particularly anxious to find out more about European Structural and Investment Fund grants to non-European recipients¹, the involvement of Chinese state-owned companies in strategic sectors² and Chinese investments and interests in European strategic infrastructure³. In reply, the Commission indicated that it did not have the requisite information in its possession. In this connection, the following questions have been submitted:

- 1. Does the Commission agree that effective European strategies to combat foreign interference in Europe must be based on comprehensive intelligence regarding the situation and the development thereof?
- 2. What steps will the Commission take to obtain without delay the necessary information regarding foreign investment and interference? When will it obtain this information?
- 3. Does the Commission agree that the absence of such data can only hamper effective parliamentary oversight?
