Question for written answer E-003715/2021 to the Commission Rule 138 Dominique Bilde (ID)

Subject: New agreement with Afghanistan on migration

On 26 April 2021, the European Union and Afghanistan signed a Joint Declaration on Migration Cooperation, replacing the October 2016 Joint Way Forward agreement.

According to Agence Europe¹, this version makes some 'improvements', such as the 'preference for voluntary return [...], better protection of children and a clearer definition of certain vulnerable groups'.

- According to the European Asylum Support Office, Afghans formed the second largest national group of asylum seekers in 2020² and represented around two fifths of unaccompanied minors in April 2021³. What 'improvements' does the new agreement make regarding the 'protection of children'?
- 2. In its answer to my written question on 2 June 2021, the Commission states that between 2016 and 2019, '18 090 Afghan nationals returned to Afghanistan from the EU, including voluntary departures'⁴. However, there were only 11 forced expulsions of Afghan nationals in France in 2017 and 2018⁵ and Afghans were the third largest group of migrants in an irregular situation between 2016 and 2018⁶. How does the Commission explain this situation and does it intend to remedy it in the context of the new agreement?
