Subject: Review of the EU Blue Card Directive and the associated risks for the EU labour market

The EU Blue Card Directive lays down the conditions for third-country nationals to enter and reside for longer than three months in the territory of the Member States and their rights in terms of undertaking highly-qualified employment. The review of the Directive covered a range of elements which place too great a burden on the EU labour market and the laws by which it is governed and which might put EU citizens at a disadvantage.

- 1. What measures have been introduced to prevent misuse of the EU Blue Card or eliminate the possibility of such misuse?
- 2. What criteria will be used to differentiate between individuals who are highly qualified and those who are not?
- 3. How will a situation in which EU citizens' chances of obtaining employment are reduced due to the influx and recruitment of third-country nationals be avoided?
