Subject: Rejection of extension request by Czech Government

The Commission has rejected the Czech Government's request for an additional 60 days to respond to its demands. As a result, the deadline fell on 22 September, which is also the date on which the extension was refused. The Commission immediately proceeded to block agricultural subsidies, affecting small and medium-sized farms in particular. These actions were all the more remarkable, coming as they did just a few days before the general elections in the Czech Republic (3 October). The Commission appears to be motivated by political considerations and not least a desire to give a boost to the socialist and communist opposition movements.

- 1. Who in the Commission was responsible for rejecting the Czech Audit Office's motivated request for an extension?
- 2. By taking measures that could directly affect the forthcoming elections in a sovereign Member State, the Commission is effectively interfering in the internal affairs of a sovereign country. What provisions of the EU Treaty is it invoking in support of such interference?
- 3. What other measures are being envisaged by the Commission to undermine governments that are critical of the EU?
