Subject: SARS-CoV-2 vaccines

In September 2021, worrying findings on the toxic effects of SARS-CoV-2 vaccines were published. On 17 September, the US Food and Drug Administration's Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee announced that the incidence of cancer was significantly higher among vaccinated patients.

And on 20 September, an independent group of renowned German pathologists presented the first results of autopsies performed on patients who had died post-vaccine. In most cases, the deaths were 'probably' or 'very probably' related to the injections. They spoke of a 'lymphocyte madness crisis'.

1. In the light of these findings, how does the Commission justify its coronavirus policy, which still paints vaccines as the saviour?
2. Can it not follow the usual way of doing things in medicine by focusing on putting in place a treatment plan and establishing the necessary procedures?
