Subject: EU-funded compensation for Spanish livestock farmers affected by the wolf-hunting ban

On 20 September 2021, the Spanish Government published Ministerial Order TED/980/2021<sup>1</sup> which extends the wolf-hunting ban in the country from south of the Douro River to the north.

This decision has sparked deep discontent in the Spanish livestock sector, which, every year, falls prey to more than 5 000 wolf attacks, setting it back an estimated EUR 5.5 million<sup>2</sup>. This issue has cost the Galician Government alone in excess of EUR 4.6 million.

- 1. Has the Spanish Government drawn on EU financial resources, such as the EAFRD programmes<sup>3</sup> and the LIFE programme<sup>4</sup>, to compensate Spanish livestock farmers for those losses?
- 2. Does the Commission know whether the Spanish Government intends to compensate those livestock farmers directly under the new common agricultural policy's eco-schemes?
