Subject: COVID-19

A declaration that was adopted at an international COVID-19 summit held in Rome from 12 to 14 September has so far been signed by 9 700 doctors worldwide (as of 11 October 2021), including Dr Malone, the inventor of mRNA technology. The declaration criticises the fact that doctors are increasingly being discouraged from participating in open professional discourse on new diseases. Moreover, they are being prevented by hospitals and health authorities from caring for their patients. This is no longer medicine but a violation of human rights, and it is putting patients' lives at risk.

1. Doctors in Germany, Austria, France and other Member States who were hitherto deemed respectable and who have now spoken out against COVID-19 measures and vaccinations have faced raids, house searches, arrests and even being stripped of their licenses. In light of this, how does the Commission view this declaration by the doctors?
2. How does the Commission assess the doctors' specific accusation that human rights are being severely violated?
