Subject: COVID-19

If the number of people suspected to have died of the COVID-19 vaccine is compared with the number of people who actually died of (not with) COVID-19, it seems that there may now be more vaccine deaths than COVID-19 deaths.

1. What is the Commission's assessment of these developments?
2. How many suspected vaccine deaths would it take for the Commission to suspend vaccinations, especially considering fact that the swine flu vaccine was suspended after just 23 suspected vaccine deaths – a figure which is currently missing two zeros, according to EMA data?
3. How does the Commission ensure that all suspected cases are properly reported?
