Subject: Increased cost of Erasmus+ programme for EU Citizens

Erasmus+ is the EU's programme to support education, training, youth and sport in Europe with an estimated budget of EUR 26.2 billion for 2021 and a commitment that the programme will be more inclusive, more digital, and greener than its predecessor.

With euro area annual inflation at 3.4 % in September 2021, up from 3.0 % in August 2021, students completing Erasmus+ in the majority of Member States are experiencing a greater financial burden when undertaking the programme and in some cases are now unable to participate in the programme due to the increased cost of living.

- 1. Noting the increased cost of living across the EU and the increased budget for the Erasmus+ programme (2021-2027), is the Commission considering a review of the grants given to successful applicants of the Erasmus+ programme?
- 2. Furthermore, is it considering an expansion of the Erasmus+ programme following the recent announcement that 2022 will be the European Year of Youth?
