I refer to this question concerning the application of the principle of subsidiarity under the 2013 Lisbon Treaty¹.

Is the Commission aware of, and does it have specific information at its disposal on, the following:

- 1. The number of subsidiarity checks undertaken by the Member States (Article 123(b) TEU) since the entry into force of the Lisbon Treaty and how many of these have been upheld by the ECJ?
- 2. The number of actions concerning compliance with the principle of conferral there have been before the ECJ since the Lisbon Treaty came into force and how many of these have been upheld by the ECJ?
- 3. The costs incurred by Germany and the other Member States as a result of treaty infringements since the Treaty of Lisbon came into force and what has happened to the monies collected?
