Subject: Need for a coordinated EU approach to tackling disinformation, foreign interference and

hybrid threats in the EU

Disinformation is a transnational threat, and no state can counter it with maximum effectiveness on its own. It takes wider EU cooperation.

Yet there is no coordinated EU-wide response on foreign interference, hybrid threats and disinformation.

- 1. Given the absence of a harmonised EU-level legal and regulatory framework on disinformation and considering the successful adoption of the EU cybersecurity strategy in December 2020, is the Commission envisaging proposing a directive or regulation against foreign interference, hybrid threats and disinformation in order to lay the regulatory foundation for multi-layered, cross-sectoral, resilient policies and deterrence tools, as part of better-coordinated national strategies at the Member State and EU levels?
- 2. Is the Commission planning to increase the resources and budget allocated to bodies and organisations tasked with monitoring, countering and raising awareness about disinformation and foreign interference?
- 3. While information sharing on disinformation and foreign interference between the EU and the Member States remains difficult, is the Commission envisaging designing a centralised unit to unify and harmonise all actions and responses to disinformation, by jointly involving all EU institutions and Member States, and including much-needed specific focal points at the national level?
