## Question for written answer E-005427/2021 to the Commission

Subject: Record of deportations by Frontex

A report by the Executive Director¹ of the European Border and Coast Guard Agency (Frontex) reveals that in the first half of 2021, Frontex was involved in the deportation of 8 239 people. This is 9 % more than in the same period in 2019 and twice as many as in 2020. However, return operations supervised by human rights monitors fell by 7 % and only 47 % of the flights coordinated by Frontex had at least one monitor present², violating its own regulation³.

We also learned that the new fundamental rights officer at Frontex has expressed concern about some of its practices and feels that his advice is not being followed<sup>4</sup>.

- Does the Commission consider not guaranteeing the presence of monitors in return operations to be a violation of Directive 2008/115/EC and Regulation (EU) No 2019/1896?
- 2. Given the allegations of rights violations in return operations, what measures does the Commission intend to take to ensure an independent monitoring system and that return operations respect fundamental rights?
- 3. What initiatives and concrete measures will the Commission propose in view of the comments made by the new Frontex fundamental rights officer?
