Proposal for a decision of the European Parliament and of the Council on a European Subject:

Year of Youth 2022 (COM(2021) 634 final)

2022 has been declared the European Year of Youth and an initiative to that end has been adopted. The initiative is intended to help ensure that EU policy includes and takes due account of the views and contributions of young people, but also their problems. The Austrian Federal Council's EU Committee also supports this resolution as well as the EU Youth Strategy, together with its objectives of a high level of participation among young people. The European Youth Strategy is supposed to provide a framework for national youth strategies. Five events will be organised by representatives in the plenary meeting of the Conference on the Future of Europe together with young people. This is supposed to offer young EU citizens an opportunity to get involved in politics.
