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Subject: Import conditions and border controls for shelf-stable composite products containing

Vitamin D

The Commission is working on amendments to Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/625 on official controls to impose new import conditions on composite foods containing Vitamin D3 derived from lanolin. As a result, many shelf-stable composite foods containing Vitamin D will become subject to official border controls and administrative import requirements. Fortified foods containing Vitamin D are important to public health as Vitamin D insufficiency is prevalent across Europe¹.

- 1. How will the Commission ensure that all legal modifications happen simultaneously with sufficient transition time to avoid supply chain disruptions for fortified foods?
- 2. Would the Commission consider exempting fortified foods containing Vitamin D that are otherwise plant-based from border controls?
- 3. When will the Commission be amending the list of shelf-stable composite products that are exempt from border controls?
