Question for written answer E-000776/2022 to the Commission Rule 138

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Subject: Impact of the pandemic on tourism

The pandemic has had a swift and radical impact on our day-to-day lives and on business turnover, plunging certain sectors, including tourism, into a deep crisis.

The Mediterranean is heavily reliant on tourism, which is an economic mainstay for countries such as Cyprus, where it is still beset by a number of imponderables arising from the pandemic. Any further setbacks to the tourism industry could have a well-nigh unstoppable domino effect on the remainder of its economy.

As winter draws to a close and the tourist season begins to get under way in countries such as Cyprus, continued funding is essential to keep the sector afloat.

In view of this:

- 1. Can the Commission say whether it has adopted an action plan to support the tourism industry?
- 2. Given that the latter is clearly in for another difficult year, what support is the Commission planning to provide in the services sector to keep it afloat?
