Subject: EU-level coordination of free transport for Ukrainian refugees

In recent days, several Member States have offered free transport to refugees fleeing the war in Ukraine. Poland was the first Member State to announce this measure, followed by Austria¹, the Czech Republic, Germany and Spain².
