Subject: EU ban on Chinese state-owned media outlets

For a long time now, the People's Republic of China and ruling Chinese Communist Party have been spreading propaganda through state-owned media outlets, to whitewash or justify human rights violations in Xinjiang that have been repeatedly condemned by the EU and give cause for EU sanctions, for example¹². In 2020, the US classified a number of Chinese media organisations as 'foreign missions'³.
