Subject: Precautionary principle and vaccinations

Italy's general medical board will start a disciplinary hearing soon concerning a doctor rebuked for deciding to apply the precautionary principle and prescribe some tests (prick test for PEF and polysorbate and thrombophilic screening) for persons with more than one morbidity, in order to assess the risk to them of an adverse reaction to the COVID vaccines. For these patients, the doctor devised a kind of Goldman risk index for an adverse event, which has been scientifically validated. This procedure complies with the principles of the code of professional practice, starting with the autonomy, independence and accountability of the medical profession, and provides for even non-conventional tests to be carried out to predict adverse events in patients with previous illnesses.

Is the Commission aware of this, and what is its opinion about it?

in light of established data on the adverse effects of the vaccinations, published by the manufacturers themselves, would the Commission address a recommendation to doctors practising in the Member States so they have a reasonable degree of protection when conducting the preliminary tests required for vaccination?
