Subject: Support for Russian undertakings from public funds

In its State of the Energy Union 2021 report<sup>1</sup>, the Commission indicated that fossil fuel subsidies amounting to EUR 52 billion were disbursed in 2020. This public money, like the financing of research projects and public-private partnerships, in part benefits Russian oil, gas and coal companies. It is unacceptable that the war of aggression against Ukraine is indirectly co-financed with Union taxpayers' money.

- 1. Over the last ten years, how much public money in total, including fossil subsidies, have Russian companies or those controlled by Russian companies received?
- Which specific Russian companies or Russian-controlled companies have received public money in the EU in the past decade through fossil subsidies, research projects and public-private partnerships?
- 3. How and by when does the Commission intend to end support for Russian fossil fuel companies?
