Subject: Are the Commission and the anti-racism coordinator taking anti-white racism into account?

In its communication of 18 September 2020 entitled 'A Union of Equality: EU Anti-racism Action Plan 2020-2025' (COM(2020)0565), the Commission stated that it would appoint an 'anti-racism' coordinator. She was appointed in 2021.

According to the aforementioned communication, the coordinator's role is to liaise closely with people belonging to racial or ethnic minorities. The coordinator relays any concerns to the Commission and collaborates with Member States, Parliament, civil society and academia to strengthen policy responses in the field of anti-racism.

The Commission's laudable efforts in this area should make it possible to combat all forms of racism and discrimination, including anti-white racism.

In view of the above:

1. Can the Commission provide a list of the racial or ethnic minority groups that it is referring to in its communication?
2. Can the Commission indicate whether the coordinator is liaising with native European people who are victims of racism?
3. Can the Commission clarify what action, if any, it has taken in relation to the fight against anti-white racism?
