Question for written answer E-002674/2022 to the Commission Rule 138 Ernest Urtasun (Verts/ALE)

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Subject: Placing of plant protection protects on the market under 'special circumstances'

Article 53 of Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 concerning the placing of plant protection products on the market provides that: 'By way of derogation from Article 28, in special circumstances a Member State may authorise, for a period not exceeding 120 days, the placing on the market of plant protection products, for limited and controlled use, where such a measure appears necessary because of a danger which cannot be contained by any other reasonable means.'

- 1. In the absence of a definition of 'special circumstances', does the Commission consider them to be special plant health circumstances or do they include any other kind, such as a plan to support and research the production of high-quality pre-basic and basic potato seed, given that the United Kingdom's departure from the EU has undermined the supply of some potato varieties?
- 2. Does it take the view that Brexit is a 'special circumstance' that could trigger exceptional authorisation of neonicotinoid thiamethoxam?
- 3. With a view to cutting the Member States' excessive discretion in this area, does the Commission plan to provide a definition of 'special circumstances' and 'reasonable means'?
